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Gender pay gap report

MacTaggart Scott is required by law to publish an annual gender pay gap report.

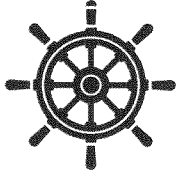
This is its report for the snapshot date of 6 April 2020.

- The mean gender pay gap for MacTaggart Scott is 22%
- The median gender pay gap for MacTaggart Scott is 18%
- The mean gender bonus gap for MacTaggart Scott is 78%
- The median gender bonus gap for MacTaggart Scott is 7%
- The proportion of male employees in MacTaggart Scott receiving a bonus is 89% and the proportion of female employees receiving a bonus is 86%

Pay quartiles by gender			
Band	Males	Females	Description
A	83%	17%	Includes all employees whose standard hourly rate places them at or below the lower quartile
B	91%	9%	Includes all employees whose standard hourly rate places them above the lower quartile but at or below the median
C	93%	7%	Includes all employees whose standard hourly rate places them above the median but at or below the upper quartile
D	98%	2%	Includes all employees whose standard hourly rate places them above the upper quartile

The figures set out above have been calculated using the standard methodologies used in the Equality Act 2010 (Gender Pay Gap Information) Regulations 2017.
